Statistics say that 1 out of every 3 people can go online. Why aren't more people connected?


- Devices are too expensive.

Its mission: Affordability

*AFFORDABILITY

 No one should have to choose between food or medicine and access to the internet. Internet.org supporters will join forces to develop technology that decreases the cost of delivering data to people worldwide, and helps expand internet access in underserved comm

Its mission: Efficiency

***EFFICIENCY**

 Transmitting data—even a text message or a simple web page—requires bandwidth, something that's scarce in many parts of the world. Partners will invest in tools and software to improve data compression capabilities and make data networks and services run more efficiently.

Its mission: Business Models

***BUSINESS MODELS**

 Connecting billions of people will be a massive global effort that requires ongoing innovation. Developers, mobile operators and device manufacturers will work together to introduce business models that give people more ways to go online.

- 17) Wikipedia-Find information.


Internet.org: Current achievements

India Columbia Ghana Zambia Kenya Botswana Tanzania







